Writing

We are looking at two text types this term: Myths and Legends and writing a character description.

Year 3 skills

Express time, place and cause using prepositions.

Use organisational devices for paragraphs

Maths

Year 3 Week 1 and 2 - Fractions

Adding and subtracting fractions, Unit and non-unit fractions of objects

Year 3 Week 3 and 4 - Money

Adding and subtracting pounds and pence, finding change Year 3 Week 5 and 6 - Shape

Right angles, parallel and perpendicular lines, drawing polygons, describing 2d and 3d shapes

Year 4 Week 1 and 2 - Decimals

Partitioning decimals, comparing and ordering decimals, rounding to the nearest whole number

Year 4 week 3 and 4 - Money

Comparing, estimating and calculating money, solving problems

Year 4 week 5 and 6 - Statistics and times tables

Interpreting charts and line graphs, drawing line graphs

Reading

Year 3

Children will be recognising literary conventions of myths and legends, and identifying language feature of different text types.

Year 4

Children will be checking that texts are meaningful and using context to understand words, and using text marking to identify key information.



Our topic, for both Year 3 and 4, is called 'To the End of the Earth'.


Year 3

Children will develop their understanding of Pentecost and how the disciples took Jesus' message forward to today. We will examine scripture that shows this. We will develop further understanding of the gifts of the Holy Spirit and how Christians show the Holy Spirit. We will learn about the Holy Trinity and the three persons of God.

Year 4

Children will consider Peter's journey after Jesus' ascension and the development, growth and structure of the Catholic church. We will learn the Apostles' Creed and what it means as a declaration of Faith.

Year 3 and 4 will also look in depth at Mary's role in the Catholic Church during the month of May.



SCIENCE

Children will be learning about Electricity and Habitats:

- Building and drawing circuits
- Conductors and insulators
- Conductivity
- Human impact on habitats
- Classification keys for plants and animals

COMPUTING

Year 3 pupils will learn about desktop publishing:

- Text and images to communicate messages
- Using templates with publishing software
- Comparing to handmade work

Year 4 pupils will be looking at photo editing:

- Exploring the many tools to edit
- The impact of editing images
- Proposing a technical and ethical editing guide

HISTORY

In History, we are looking at the Anglo Saxons:

- The end of Anglo Saxon rule

PSHE

In PSHE, we will be Exploring emotions.

- Recognising emotions and that different emotions can often conflict
- Responding appropriately to others' emotions
- How our actions affect ourselves and others
- Ways to deal with emotions

MUSIC

Our new music topic is called 'Ballads' and we will be looking specifically at:

- Features of a ballad
- Performing a song with lyrics and actions
- Writing to accompany a storyline
- Writing lyrics which rhyme
- Performing a song
