Writing

This half term, we will be using two texts:

Stone Age Boy

Stone Age to Iron Age

We will use these texts as inspiration for all our writing across the half term.

Children will have the opportunity to write a diary and a non-chronological report.

Reading

In our reading sessions, all children will draw inferences such as inferring characters' feelings, thoughts and motives from their actions, and justifying inferences with evidence. We will also use dictionaries to check the meaning of words that they have read.

We will also be starting our whole class reading books too.




Maths

To begin the year, both year groups will be completing White Rose blocks on:
Year 3: Fractions and Mass & Capacity
Year 3/4: Fractions and Mass & Capacity
Year 4: Fractions and Decimals

They will also continue their CLIC sessions to recall and retrieve basic skills in maths.

Texts





RE

This term our RE topic is called 'Desert to Garden'. Year 3 will explore the scripture, the feeding of the five thousand, the Last Supper, they will make links between the Last Supper and Mass.

Year 4 will explore the parable, The Prodigal Son and will study and sequence the events of Holy week.

They will also be finding out about the corporal works of mercy.

Science

This term, we will explore light and darkness as the absence of light. They will learn how light reflects off surfaces, recognise the dangers of sunlight, and discover ways to protect their eyes. We will also investigate shadows and classify light sources as natural, like the sun, and artificial, such as lamps..

Year 3/4

LENT 2

History

This term, we will learn about how people lived from the Stone Age to the Iron Age. We will explore how Stone Age people were nomadic and used simple tools for hunting. We'll discover the Neolithic Revolution, when farming began. Later, in the Bronze Age, we'll see how settlements grew and trade became important. Finally, we will investigate Iron Age life and important places like Stonehenge and hill forts.

Computing

Year 3 will make branching databases using yes/no questions. We will work with a partner to share what we learn.

This term, Year 4 will explore data loggers, analysing data with computers, and testing planned processes for their effectiveness.

Art

This half term will focus on teaching children the use of shapes, shading, and texture in art to enhance their drawing skills. It emphasises developing a sense of light and dark, using frottage for texture, and experimenting with different tools to create expressive and abstract art.

PSHE

Our topic in PSHE is Economic Wellbeing.

This term, we will explore budgeting, investigate job stereotypes, examine career options, compare spending and saving, and analyse why stereotypes shouldn't dictate career paths.

Music

This term, we will be practising our performance skills. We will focus on performing the Easter Play songs and performing them with confidence Year 3/4

LENT 2

PE

This term, Year 3, will be developing their athletics skills through practising their sprinting technique, developing their handover technique in relay, and investigating jumping positions and jumping techniques. They will also be practising their ball skills.

This term, Year 4 will practise their invasion game skills in Handball. They will work on teamwork, tactics, posession as well as dribbling, shooting, throwing and catching.

Forest Schools

This half term, pupils will continue to develop their skills with knots, rules, nature art and den building, as well as developing their skills when using a range of tools.

Please ensure that children have brought a pair of wellies (with socks) to keep at school for Forest Schools. Please also remember the children will continue to need their arms and legs covered for each session.

French

In French, we are learning about items in a French classroom. We are also learning how to ask and answer questions and read and understand short sentences about the topic: In a French classroom.
