SATs tests


Year 5 will continue with CLIC while year 6 will continue to practice arithmetic style SATs questions daily.

# PENTECOST

### History

Our history topic this term is a Victorian study focused on the Industrial Revolution and its local impact. Children will explore how urbanisation and machine labour transformed Britain, using sources and artefacts to investigate changes in the local area.

### Computing

Our computing strand this term is 'Creating Media'.

Year 5 will be learning about creating vector drawings using online software.

Our topic in PSHE is Me, My Body and My Health.
