Writing

This half term, we will be using two texts: Escape from Pompeii by Christina Balit and The Journal of Iliona – A Young Slave by Richard Plat. We will use these texts as inspiration for all our writing across the half term.

Children will have the opportunity to write a historical retell and an informal letter from Illiona's point of view.

Reading

This term, we will be identifying themes and conventions in a wide range of books and predicting what might happen from details stated and implied.

Maths

This term, Year 3 will be completing White Rose blocks on: Shape, Time and Statistics.

Year 3/4: Money, Shape, Position and direction and Statistics.

Year 4: Time, Shape, Position and direction and Statistics.

They will also continue their CLIC sessions to recall and retrieve basic skills in maths.

RE

This term our RE topic is called Dialogue and Encounter. The children will learn about Islam including the Holy book, place of worship and the Five Pillars of Islam.

Science

This term, Year 3/4 will finish their studies on plants and learn about forces, magnets and sustainability.

The children will explore forces and plan and conduct a friction experiment. They will also identify magnets including magnetic and nonmagnetic materials and will investigate materials using magnets. Finally the children will learn what biodiversity is and how we can increase it in our local area.

PENTECOST 2

Computing

Year 3 will be exploring Scratch. The children will explain how a sprite moves in an existing project and create a program to move a sprite in four directions. They will also identify and fix bugs in a program and design and create a maze-based challenge.

This term, Year 4 will also explore Scratch. In this unit, the children will learn how to develop the use of count-controlled loops in a different programming environment and explain that in programming there are infinite loops and count-controlled loops. They will also design a project that includes repetition. This half term we will explore Power Prints.

Art

The children will learn how to draw using tone to create a 3D effect as well as explore tone and proportion when drawing. They will also use shading techniques to create pattern and contrast and finally work collaboratively to develop drawings into prints.

Geography

PSHE

Our Year 4 topic in PSHE is 'Life Cycles'.

Year 4 children will learn that we are handmade by God with the help of our parents and know what the Christian faith says about death and eternal life as well as strategies on how to deal with grief.

History

This term, we are exploring The Roman Empire and Roman Britain. The children will learn how Romans soldiers

were equipped for war and understand Roman army battle formations.

They will also learn about the Roman legacy in Britain and understand the resistance that the Romans met in Britain.

Forest Schools

This half term, pupils will continue to develop their skills with knots, rules, nature art and den building, as well as developing their skills when using a range of tools.

Please ensure that children have brought a pair of wellies (with socks) to keep at school for Forest Schools. Please also remember the children will continue to need their arms and legs covered for each session. This term will explore food chains. In our French lessons, we will learn new vocabulary, like 'un chat' (a cat) and 'une pomme' (an apple). The children will confidently present their sentences in class, using accurate pronunciation. We will also gather new words from the dictionary and find alternative vocabulary, ensuring everyone expresses themselves well.



This term Year 3, we will be exploring tennis and basketball. The children will learn to hit the ball accurately as well as develop their throwing skills.

Year 4 will be exploring tennis and cricket. The children will learn to bat and field accurately as well as develop their throwing and catching skills.

French
